

Our Beliefs

God

We believe in one true God who exists eternally as three distinct yet equal Persons: God the Father, God the Son (Jesus) and God the Holy Spirit. We believe that God created humans to have a relationship with Him. We believe that He cares deeply for all of humanity, desires for each and every person to find their way back to a restored relationship with Him, and has made this possible through Jesus.

Jesus

It is the absolute and final source of truth and is authoritative for Christian beliefs and living.

Humanity

As a result, we are all in need of God's forgiveness, healing, and restoration - but we have freedom to choose whether to receive that forgiveness by believing in Jesus or whether to do our own thing and continue living in brokenness, forever separated from our Creator.

New Life

We believe that, through Jesus, God freely offers us forgiveness for our sin and the gift of eternal life (being restored back into relationship with Him). There's nothing we can do to earn this gift; it is a gift we simply receive by trusting in and choosing to follow Jesus. This new life begins the moment we truly accept Jesus into our life by faith through prayer. The inward evidence of accepting Jesus is the presence and leading of Holy Spirit. The outward evidence is a life lived in Godly holiness that points others to Jesus as we grow and mature in our faith.

Heaven & Hell

We believe that heaven is the glorious, everlasting home of all who love and trust Jesus as their Lord and Saviour. Not only is it a place of eternal relationship with our loving, compassionate, faithful, just Creator, the Bible describes it as a place where there is no suffering, no pain, no tears. It is literally the perfect place! But - for it to forever remain perfect - it is only those who have received forgiveness for sins and new life in Jesus who can enter.

Sadly, hell is quite the opposite: Hell is a place of everlasting isolation and suffering. It is a place of torment, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth, where suffering will be unbearable, with no relief. No wonder God doesn't want anyone to be there! But it is ultimately our choice: God gave us free will so that we could truly love Him. But if we reject the love, mercy, and forgiveness He offers us through Jesus, we face eternal separation from Him in hell.

We have one life to decide whether we will receive God's great gift of endless life, love and joy by making Jesus our Lord. If we reject Him, hell is the consequence - and the only alternative.
